## Remarks by Ambassador Emaleen Abd Rahman Teo Chair of the Committee of Permanent Representatives to ASEAN (CPR)

We emerged stronger and grew closer as a result.

We realise that our future is intertwined and that we must put our people at the forefront of our efforts to build our community. For this reason, Brunei Darussalam with this year's theme, "Our People, Our Future Together" has emphasised the role of our people in ASEAN's community building efforts. Throughout its chairmanship, Brunei Darussalam has organised programmes that are intended to equip our young people who are our future citizens, with the necessary attributes and values for tommorrow challenges.

At the same time, we recognise that for us to realise a truly peoplecentred community, our people must have a sense of belonging to ASEAN and the results from our work must trickle down to the people so that they will feel the benefits. Towards this end, raising the people's awareness of ASEAN is crucial so they will not only feel that they are part of the ASEAN community but that they can also take advantage of the benefits that ASEAN can offer them.

Excellencies, Distinguished Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen,

ASEAN's success today would not have been possible without the support and assistance of our dialogue partners and friends. We are appreciative of their friendship and support and ASEAN will continue to work closely with our partners and friends to strengthen our partnerships and to ensure the maintenance of peace, stability and prosperity in the region.
