


IMPLEMENTATION OF AEC 2015

☐ AEC Scorecard

- New baseline of 506 measures
 - ❖ Include fully implemented ASEAN-wide measures since 2008 and 54 high-priority measures identified at AEM Retreat
 - There were <u>only</u> 316 measures when AEC Blueprint was first launched in 2007

- As at **July 2015**, 463 out of 506 measures have been implemented
 - Implementation rate of 91.5%

KEY OUTCOMES - TRADE

□ SELF-CERTIFICATION

- Good progress in operationalizing self-certification pilot projects
- Key elements for region-wide self-certification being developed and will be fully implemented in 2016

☐ NATIONAL TRADE REPOSITORY

ASEAN Trade Repository will be established to link up all National Trade Repository to provide one-stop online database on all trade-related information

☐ ASEAN SINGLE WINDOW

Work towards timely completion of full-fledged pilot testing of ASEAN Single Window by 2015

☐ ASEAN SOLUTIONS FOR INVESTMENTS, SERVICES AND TRADE

Internet-based facility for receiving, processing and responding to complaints by private sector is being developed

KEY OUTCOMES - STANDARDS

☐ STAGE I - HARMONIZATION OF STANDARDS

- Automotive (15), Electrical & Electronics (121), Prepared Foodstuff (5), Pharmaceutical (7), Rubber (46), Traditional Medicines & Health Supplements (17)
- Work in progress
 - Building & Construction, Medical Device, Wood

☐ STAGE II - MUTUAL RECOGNITION ARRANGEMENT

- > Implemented
 - ❖ MRA on Electrical and Electronic Equipment
 - √ 16 testing laboratories and 5 certification bodies
 - GMP Inspection of Manufacturers of Medicinal Products
 - √ 4 inspection services
- Work in progress
 - Type Approval for Automotive Products
 - Inspection and Certification System on Food Hygiene
 - Building and Construction
 - Bio-Equivalence Study Report (Pharmaceuticals)

KEY OUTCOMES - STANDARDS

☐ STAGE III - REGULATORY COHERENCE

- > ASEAN Harmonized Cosmetic Regulatory Scheme
- Agreement on ASEAN Harmonised Electrical and Electronic Equipment Regulatory Regime
- ASEAN Medical Directive
- Work in progress
 - Prepared Foodstuff
 - Traditional Medicines and Health Supplements

KEY OUTCOMES – SERVICES & INVESTMENT

☐ SERVICES

- Figure 5 Efforts are being undertaken to conclude 9th & 10th packages by end 2015
 - * Restrictions for trade in over 120 services sub-sectors will be minimized
- Movement of skilled professionals through concluded MRAs
 - Professional engineers and architects

☐ INVESTMENT

- > Commitment to further enhance ASEAN as single investment destination
 - Conduct annual peer review
 - Minimized restrictions to the flow of investment
 - Undertook reform in investment related policies
 - Pursue further liberalization measures under ACIA

KEY OUTCOMES - OTHER AREAS OF COOPERATION

☐ COMPETITION

- > 8 AMS enacted their respective competition law
- > Capacity building to enforce competition law and advocate competition
- Strategic ASEAN Competition Action Plan 2016-2025 completed

☐ INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

- Progress made in reducing turnaround time for trademark process
 - Trademark classification database launched (ASEAN TMclass)
- On-line submission of patents applications launched
 - e-ASEAN Patent Search and Examination Cooperation (ASPEC)
- On-line search tool for published and registered industrial designs
 - ❖ ASEAN Designview
- > ASEAN Strategic IPR Action Plan 2025 completed

☐ CONSUMER PROTECTION

- > 9 AMS put in place their respective consumer protection law
- > Efforts to enhance consumer protection awareness
- > Strategic ASEAN Action Plan on Consumer Protection 2016-2025 completed

KEY OUTCOMES - SMEs

☐ SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES

- Access to information
 - ❖ Development of ASEAN SME Service Web Portal
 - Information pack on tariffs, rules of origin, customs procedures
- Access to finance
 - Developed ASEAN Benchmark for SME Credit Rating System
 - Policy studies with concrete proposals including financial inclusion
- Promote SME participation in supply chain
 - Completed training on garments, footwear and electronic sectors
 - Training on automotive and healthcare to be conducted later this year
- ASEAN Strategic Action Plan for SME Development 2016-2025 completed

ENGAGEMENT WITH PRIVATE SECTOR

☐ ASEAN BUSINESS ADVISORY COUNCIL

- ➤ ABAC step up its engagement with other ASEAN+1 Business Councils to exchange views on issues and provide recommendations on how these issues could be addressed to both Leaders and Ministers
- ABAC also had consultations with sectoral bodies to provides inputs to:
 - **❖** ASEAN Strategic Action Plan for SME Development (2016-2025)
 - ❖ AEC 2025 Blueprint
- ➤ ABAC 2015 Policy Recommendations, amongst others, include:
 - Elimination of NTMs/NTBs within and beyond PIS
 - Deepening of financial sector integration
 - Development of sound financial infrastructure
 - Liberalize the movement of skilled professional across the region

KEY OUTCOMES – EXTERNAL RELATIONS

□ ASEAN-CHINA

Negotiation on upgrading ACFTA on-going

□ ASEAN-JAPAN

> Guidelines for transposing tariff reduction schedules under AJCEP adopted

□ ASEAN-KOREA

- Third Protocol to Amend ASEAN-Korea Trade in Goods Agreement finalized for signing
 - Modality for further liberalisation of sensitive products under AKFTA endorsed

□ ASEAN-INDIA

- ASEAN-India Trade in Services and Investment Agreements ratified
 - Entry into force by 1 July 2015
- Scope of the review of ASEAN India TIG Agreement finalized

□ ASEAN-AUSTRALIA-NEW ZEALAND

- Protocol to Amend the Agreement establishing the AANZFTA
 - Entry into force by 1 October 2015

KEY OUTCOMES – EXTERNAL RELATIONS

☐ ASEAN-HONG KONG, CHINA

> Four rounds of negotiation concluded

□ ASEAN-UNITED STATES

> Discussions are on-going to further enhance areas of cooperation

□ ASEAN-RUSSIA

Endorsed Post-2015 ASEAN-Russia Trade and Investment Cooperation Work Programme

□ ASEAN-CANADA

➤ Endorsed 2016-2020 ASEAN-Canada Trade and Investment Work Plan

□ RCEP

- Nine rounds of negotiation concluded
- > Breakthroughs in resolving a number of issues being negotiated
- Negotiations will be expedited to substantially conclude by end 2015
